Intensively Processed Data Collections, 1991–1992

In addition to undergoing standard operations routinely performed on all ICPSR collections, the data collections in this category have been checked for undocumented codes and for consistency, corrected if necessary, and formatted to ICPSR specifications. Also, the data may have been recoded and reorganized in consultation with the investigator to maximize their utilization and accessibility. A machine-readable codebook has been produced; this codebook fully documents the data and may include descriptive statistics such as frequencies or means. SPSS and SAS control statements have been prepared for many of these collections, and many are available in multiple technical formats. Some collections in this category have codebooks available in printed form, a copy of which is supplied routinely to each Official Representative.

Routinely Processed Data Collections, 1991–1992

All routinely processed ICPSR data collections have been checked to determine that data and documentation correspond. For those collections containing confidential information, the sensitive information has been removed or re-coded to protect the anonymity of respondents. Routinely processed collections usually are made available in the original format provided by the principal investigator. The documentation for these studies may be machine-readable or may be reproduced from the material originally received. Hard copy documentation may have been converted to machine-readable form through OCR (Optical Character Recognition) scanning. ICPSR enhances the documentation by adding a bibliographic citation and introductory materials describing the collection. One copy of the documentation is supplied when the data are requested.

Constitution

Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research

Preamble

The Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research was founded at the University of Michigan in 1962 and is currently governed under a Memorandum of Organization as a partnership between member institutions and the Center for Political Studies of the Institute for Social Research. This Constitution and the accompanying Bylaws establish the organizational identity for ICPSR. The Bylaws authorize ICPSR to affiliate for specific purposes with a host institution.

Article I. Name

This organization will be called the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR).

Article II. Purposes

The purposes of the ICPSR are to promote and facilitate research and instruction in the social sciences and related areas, by acquiring, developing, archiving, and disseminating data and documentation for instruction and research; conducting related instructional programs; conducting such other activities as may be authorized in accord with the Bylaws; and obtaining the resources necessary to accomplish these purposes.

Article III. Membership

The eligible membership of ICPSR includes: (1) institutions of higher education, units within institutions of higher education, and federations of educational institutions; and (2) such institutions and organizations as may subsequently be designated in accord with the Bylaws. Categories of membership will be designated in the Bylaws. Services will be provided to members and others in accord with the Bylaws.

Article IV. Governance

Each member will be represented by an Official Representative chosen by the member. Representation arrangements for federations and national memberships will be set forth in the Bylaws. The membership through the Official Representatives will elect a Council to serve as the Executive Committee of the membership, with authority to act on behalf of the member institutions, employ personnel, enter into contracts, and carry out activities to execute the purposes specified in Article II. The composition, election, and organization of the Council will be set forth in the Bylaws.

Article V. Voting Rights

Each member in good standing, as specified in the Bylaws, will have one vote, to be cast by the Official Representative designated by the member.

Article VI. Meetings

The Council will hold regular and special meetings as provided in the Bylaws, but no less than once a year. The Official Representatives will meet at regular intervals as provided in the Bylaws.

Article VII. Dues

The Council will establish annual membership dues, which may vary according to category of membership and be separately negotiated for each federation and national membership. Members must be notified one year in advance of an increase in dues.

Article VIII. Fiscal Policies

Membership dues are to be used exclusively to finance activities and services on behalf of member institutions in accord with the purposes specified in Article I. Under the direction and with the approval of the Council, and congruent with its purposes, ICPSR may charge fees and seek and expend funds in addition to membership dues.

Article IX. Bylaws

ICPSR may adopt Bylaws, consistent with this Constitution, for the conduct of its affairs. Bylaws may be enacted, amended, or repealed: (1) by a two-thirds majority vote of all members of the Council eligible to vote, at a meeting of the Council or in a mail ballot after written notice of at least 30 days; or (2) by a majority vote of the Official Representatives eligible to vote, in a mail ballot after written notice of at least 90 days.

Article X. Amendments

Proposals to amend the Constitution may be initiated by majority vote of the Council or by a petition presented to the Council signed by Official Representatives of at least 25 member institutions. Amendments may be adopted by a two-thirds majority vote of the Official Representatives eligible to vote, in a mail ballot after written notice of at least 90 days.

Article XI. Ratification

This Constitution becomes effective when adopted by a two-thirds majority vote of all members of the Council eligible to vote.

Bylaws

Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research

Preamble

These Bylaws are authorized by the Constitution of the ICPSR. The terms of the Preamble to the Constitution are applicable.

Article I. Membership

1. Conditions of Membership

A. Members will be assigned to categories based upon the member's size, program, and location. If the membership is formally held by a department or other unit, the characteristics of the entire university or organization will be considered in assigning a membership category. Guidelines for membership categories are:

Category A: Educational institutions with doctoral programs in the social sciences or related areas.

Category B: Undergraduate institutions without doctoral programs in the social sciences or related areas and with enrollments of 2,500 or more students.

Category S: Colleges without doctoral programs in the social sciences or related areas and with enrollments of fewer than 2,500 students.

Category C: Institutions in developing countries.

Categories F and N: Federated and national memberships consist of a number of institutions in categories A, B, C, and S that have joined together around a common link to the ICPSR. The common link is responsible for distributing data and documentation from the ICPSR to the other members. Dues are assessed based on the actual configuration of memberships.

B. Not-for-profit research organizations having a clearly defined educational mission may, with approval of the Council, become members of ICPSR and be assigned to a membership category.

C. Internal arrangements bearing upon the sources of financial support for the membership are the responsibility of the member. Each member is responsible for determining the eligibility of its faculty, staff, and students for participation in ICPSR activities.

D. Associate Membership may be requested by other not-for-profit organizations having a clearly defined educational mission. Provision of services and appropriate dues will be set by Council. Associate membership does not carry voting privileges.

E. Membership should be sought only with the expectation that benefits accrue with continuing participation. Short-term memberships are discouraged. Officials of member institutions agree to attempt to provide the necessary dues and local support on a continuing basis.

F. Annual membership dues shall be paid by July 1 or at the beginning of such alternative annual membership cycle as may be agreed upon by individual members and ICPSR. Budgetary inability to meet a single year's membership dues will not necessitate termination of membership provided that the member is willing to make up the deficit across an agreed upon period not to exceed five years.

G. A member may withdraw from membership after one year's written notice mailed to the Executive Director. Except under special circumstances, the ICPSR will require that use of all materials provided by ICPSR, including data and documentation, be discontinued upon termination of membership.

H. A member may rejoin the ICPSR after dropping its membership. Payment of a "re-entry" fee of fifty percent of the annual dues in effect at the time of rejoining will normally be required. This fee is in addition to membership dues from the date of rejoining.

2. Benefits and Obligations of Membership

A. The ICPSR staff will endeavor to provide equitable services to each member. Given the variety of functions, the limitations on time and space in the performance of some activities, and the variable pace of research activities at member institutions, the goal shall be equality in service over a period of years.

B. Members will not distribute data or other materials supplied by ICPSR to other members, organizations, or individuals at other institutions, without the written agreement of ICPSR.

C. Member institutions agree that data and other materials provided by ICPSR are to be used solely for statistical analysis and reporting of aggregated information, and not for investigation of specific individuals or organizations, except when identification is authorized in writing by ICPSR. Each member institution gives assurance that such uses of statistical data will conform to widely-accepted standards of practice and legal restrictions that are intended to protect the confidentiality of research subjects.

D. Books, articles, conference papers, theses, dissertations, and other publications or reports that employ data or other resources provided by ICPSR should cite both original data collectors and ICPSR as the source, in accord with recommended citation procedures for computer files in the social sciences.

E. Individuals who collect data or develop other research or instructional resources of general interest to the social science community are invited to make such resources available to the membership by offering them for deposit with ICPSR.

F. Member institutions, through their Official Representatives, have the right to express concerns and complaints about services to the Executive Director, and if a matter is not satisfactorily resolved to file a grievance with Council. Council will investigate grievances and take such action as may be appropriate.

3. Services for Nonmembers

A. ICPSR data and documentation will be provided to individuals who are not affiliated with a member institution. Such individuals requesting data for their research or instructional use will sign a loan agreement, and submit payment for charges assessed, before data are provided. ICPSR data and documentation may be provided to nonmember organizations on a basis negotiated by the organization and the Executive Director and approved by Council. Resources made available by ICPSR to nonmembers shall not be redistributed or sold to other individuals or organizations without the written agreement of ICPSR.

B. Participation in ICPSR training functions or special research conferences supported solely by membership dues will be limited to students, faculty and staff from member institutions, unless exceptions are authorized by Council or the Executive Director.

Article II. Official Representatives

Each member, including each national membership and each participant in a federation, will be represented by an Official Representative chosen by the member. The Official Representative serves as the liaison between ICPSR and the member and represents the member at meetings of Official Representatives. A member may designate a second Official Representative to aid in the provision of services to the member or membership and to attend meetings of Official Representatives. Special representation arrangements for a national membership or federation may be negotiated by ICPSR Senior Staff and approved by the Council.

Article III. Council

1. Membership

The Council of the ICPSR consists of twelve persons elected by the membership. Six new Council members will be elected every two years to serve four-year terms. The Council will include the past Council Chairperson and the Associate Directors as ex-officio non-voting members.

2. Duties

A. The Council is the Executive Committee of the membership and the governing body of the ICPSR. The Council is authorized to act on behalf of the ICPSR. The Council participates in the definition of organizational objectives and in the determination of policies to achieve those objectives. It is authorized to affiliate with other organizations for

the purpose of developing organizational and fiscal arrangements of benefit to the ICPSR and its members. Actions taken on behalf of the ICPSR by ICPSR staff or staff of organizations with which the ICPSR is affiliated are subject to Council review.

B. The Council will establish policies and procedures for approving activities to be carried out on behalf of the ICPSR, such as seeking grants, contracts, and other outside financial support, collaborating or participating in committees and studies, and undertaking a major data collection.

C. The Council will establish policies regulating the participation of individuals in training programs and other activities for which limited resources preclude the simultaneous participation of all who might be interested.

D. The Council will receive an annual report from the Executive Director and Senior Staff. The report will review and project ICPSR activities, revenues, and expenditures for the past year, current year, and coming year. The Council will transmit a summary of this report along with any recommendations it may have to the Official Representatives. The Council may request, and is entitled to receive, any additional information it deems useful concerning the operations and fiscal affairs of the ICPSR.

3. Meetings

The Council will normally hold three regular meetings each year. A special meeting of the Council may be called by the Chairperson, the Executive Director, six members of the Council, or other persons as agreed to by the Council. Seven members of the Council will constitute a quorum for Council action. The Executive Director, Senior Staff of ICPSR, a representative of the host organization with which the ICPSR has affiliated, and invited guests may attend open sessions of Council meetings. The Council may hold closed or executive sessions for specific purposes.

Article IV. Officers of the Council

1. Chairperson

A. The Chairperson of the Council will be elected by the membership (see Article VII). The Chairperson will normally be nominated from among the Council members who will be serving the third year of their term and will serve a two-year term as Chairperson.

B. The Chairperson is responsible for signing documents on behalf of the Council. The Chairperson will act as a liaison between the Executive Director and the Council and as a liaison between the Director of the host organization with which ICPSR is affiliated and the Council. The Chairperson will normally chair meetings of Official Representatives.

C. The Council may appoint an acting Chairperson to serve when the Chairperson is not available to execute duties of the Chair.

2. Other Officers

The Council may designate and appoint other officers to carry out duties of the Council.

Article V. Past Chairperson of the Council

The immediate past Chairperson of the Council will serve as an ex-officio member of the Council for a period of two years.

Article VI. Associate Directors

The Executive Director, with the advice and consent of the Council, may appoint Associate Directors for specified terms. Associate Directors will serve as ex-officio members of the Council and in such other capacities as the Council designates.

Article VII. Elections

1. Nomination

A. The Nominating Committee for elections to the Council will be composed of the Council Chairperson serving as chair of the Committee, the other Council members serving in the final half of their terms, and at least two individuals not currently members of the Council designated by the Council Chairperson.

B. The Chairperson, acting on behalf of the Committee, will solicit nominations from Council members, Official Representatives, the ICPSR Executive Director and Senior Staff, Associate Directors, and the responsible executive official of the host institution. Nominees must be from member institutions. The Executive Director will gather and present to the nominating committee information on potential candidates. The Nominating Committee will present to the Official Representatives the names of a proposed Chairperson (see Article IV, Section 1) and nominees to the Council, with adequate time to allow additional nominations by Official Representatives in accord with stated procedures determined by the Council.

2. Election

A. Ballots will be mailed to those Official Representatives eligible to vote. Election to each position will be by majority vote among votes properly cast for that position.

B. The Council, by two-thirds vote of its members, may remove a member from Council for cause, such as persistent non-performance of duties.

C. Vacancies that occur on the Council or in the office of the Council Chairperson between elections will be filled through appointment by the Council.

3. Terms of Office

The newly elected Council members and the newly elected Council Chairperson will assume office at the first regular meeting following the election and will serve until the beginning of the first regular meeting after their successors have been elected.

Article VIII. Committees

The Council has the authority to create standing committees. The Chairperson, in consultation with the Council, will make appointments to standing committees. A standing committee will normally include at least one member of the Council. The Chairperson may establish and make appointments to ad hoc committees.

Article IX. Executive Director and Senior Staff

1. Positions

The chief executive officer of the ICPSR is the Executive Director. The ICPSR staff will consist of such personnel as are necessary for ICPSR to perform the activities required to fulfill its constitutionally defined purposes and meet its obligations to its membership and Council. The Executive Director may designate, with consent of Council, selected managerial, supervisory, and professional personnel as ICPSR Senior Staff. The Executive Director, and the Senior Staff through the Executive Director, are responsible to the Council for the conduct of ICPSR affairs and to the host institution for adherence to its rules and regulations.

2. Evaluation

The Chairperson and other Council members designated by the Council are authorized to participate, along with responsible officials of the host institution, in the evaluation of job performance and recommendations for merit raises and promotion of the Executive Director and the Senior Staff. The Executive Director and the Senior Staff have the right to file job and other grievances with the Council. The Council will receive and investigate such grievances and take such action as may be appropriate within its authority. These provisions do not preclude or preempt use by the Executive Director and Senior Staff of normal grievance procedures of the host institution. Upon request, the Council may participate on behalf of the Executive Director or Senior Staff in grievance proceedings of the host institution in accord with the regulations of the host institution.

3. Access to Council

The Executive Director and Senior Staff, individually and collectively, have the right to bring issues and concerns to the Council Chairperson, the chairperson of a Council committee, or an individual member of Council. If formal Council response or action is requested or required, the matter will be communicated in writing to the Chairperson. The Council may establish investigative and grievance procedures to protect individual rights and assure fair and prompt response.

Article X. Institutional Affiliations

The ICPSR Council is authorized to adopt one or more Memoranda of Agreement that affiliate the ICPSR with the University of Michigan Center for Political Studies or other host institutions. A Memorandum of Agreement may designate the host institution to serve as fiscal agent for the ICPSR. All affiliation agreements shall be reviewed by the Council at regular intervals. An affiliation with a host institution may be terminated by the Council in accord with provisions of an operative Memorandum of Agreement.

Memorandum of Agreement

Definitions:

- "ICPSR" means the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research.
- "CPS" means the Center for Political Studies.
- "ISR" means the Institute for Social Research.
- "University" means the University of Michigan.
- "Director" means the Director of CPS.
- "Chairperson" means the Chairperson of the ICPSR Council.
- "Executive Director" means the Executive Director of ICPSR.

Preamble

ICPSR and CPS enter into an agreement of affiliation to assist ICPSR to provide the resources and facilities and perform the activities required to fulfill its constitutionally defined purposes and meet its obligations to its membership and elected Council. This affiliation allows ICPSR to function within CPS, in accord with the terms of this Memorandum and consistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of ICPSR, the Bylaws of CPS, and the regulations of ISR and the University.

Section I. ICPSR Personnel

1. The Executive Director

A. Appointment. The Executive Director, as an employee of the University of Michigan, will be appointed by the Director, with the endorsement of the Chairperson and the advice and consent of the ICPSR Council, for a fixed term not to exceed five years. Reappointment for additional terms is possible.

B. Programmatic Review. Prior to the conclusion of an incumbent Executive Director's term of office, or upon the occurrence of a vacancy in the office, a Review Committee will normally be established, appointed jointly by the Chairperson and the Director. The Review Committee will include at least one member of the primary research staff of CPS. The Review Committee will be asked to provide an assessment of ICPSR's current fiscal and administrative status, operations, and performance in carrying out its purposes as set forth in the Constitution, and to offer advice and recommendations concerning its future.

C. Nomination Committee. After the programmatic review has been completed, the Director, in consultation and agreement with the Chairperson, will appoint a Nomination Committee. The Nomination Committee will include a member of the primary research staff of CPS, a member of the ICPSR Council, and a member of the ICPSR Senior Staff, and may include additional members.

To assess the leadership needs of ICPSR, the Nomination Committee will consider the report of the Review Committee and the views of ICPSR Council, ICPSR senior staff, and the primary research staff of CPS. If the incumbent Executive Director is willing to serve an additional term, and the Nomination Committee considers that he or she would be an effective leader for the future, the Committee may recommend reappointment. If reappointment of the incumbent Executive Director is not possible, or if the Committee believes it beneficial to consider other candidates, the Committee will prepare a statement of qualifications for the position and conduct a search for candidates in accordance with University affirmative action procedures and personnel regulations. The Nomination Committee will ask the ICPSR Council, ICPSR Senior Staff, primary research staff of CPS, and members of the social science community to suggest individuals for the position.

The Nomination Committee will report to the Director and the Chairperson. The report will include the names of the candidates who were considered, the criteria that were utilized in selecting the nominees, and the names of one or more nominees recommended for appointment.

D. Appointment Process. The Director and the Chairperson will discuss the report of the Nomination Committee with the ICPSR Council, Executive Director, and Senior Staff, the primary research staff of CPS, the Director of ISR, the Directors of other Centers within ISR, and appropriate university and departmental persons at the University. An offer of appointment requires the consent of the ICPSR Council. If the Director and the ICPSR Council have difficulty reaching agreement on the choice of candidate or terms of appointment, the good offices of the Director of ISR will be enlisted to seek resolution. The offer of appointment will be made by the Director, with the endorsement of the Chairperson.

E. Performance Review and Remuneration. A review of the job performance of the Executive Director in meeting the missions and goals of the ICPSR will be carried out by the Director annually or at the intervals and times provided for employees in similar positions at the University. The Director will consult with the Chairperson about the nature of the performance review, and they will agree upon the performance evaluation and proposed merit increments in salary and other changes in remuneration. In case of disagreement, the Director of ISR will be asked to mediate and, if necessary, make a decision. If the Executive Director's University appointment is split among ICPSR and other units, the Chairperson will be informed about the evaluations and proposed merit increments of the other units and will be consulted about the University's aggregate remuneration for the Executive Director.

F. Interim Appointment. If the position of Executive Director becomes vacant, the Director, with the advice and consent of the ICPSR Council, may appoint an Interim Executive Director. An interim appointment will be for no more than one year, but such appointments may be extended for up to one additional year with the advice and consent of the ICPSR Council.

2. ICPSR Staff

A. Appointment. ICPSR staff are formally appointed as members and employees of CPS. Appointments to the staff of ICPSR are made by the Executive Director, in conformity with normal employment regulations of CPS, ISR, and the University. Appointments are subject to the processes of review and approval by CPS that are normal for the type of appointment.

B. Performance Evaluation and Remuneration. Evaluation and remuneration of ICPSR staff will be based upon the job performance of these employees in meeting the missions and goals of the ICPSR. For an individual with a joint appointment outside ICPSR, performance in meeting ICPSR responsibilities and performance in meeting responsibilities with one or more other appointments will be reviewed separately and independently. The combined results of these reviews will provide the basis for determining an aggregate performance evaluation and remuneration.

Performance reviews of the Senior Staff of ICPSR will be carried out by the Executive Director at the intervals and times provided for employees in accordance with the University of Michigan's Standard Practice Guide. The Executive Director will make available to the Director the material used for the performance reviews and will make recommendations for merit increments in salary. These will be acted upon, consistent with University guidelines, by the Director. In cases of irreconcilable differences between the Executive Director and the Director concerning staff evaluations or merit increments, the Chairperson will be consulted before the Director makes a final determination.

Performance reviews of other ICPSR staff will be carried out at the intervals and times provided for employees in accordance with the University of Michigan's Standard Practice Guide. Recommendations on performance evaluations and merit salary increments will be subject to normal procedural review by CPS.

The Executive Director and the Senior Staff have the right to file job and other grievances with the Council. The Council will receive and investigate such grievances and take such action as may be appropriate within its authority, but in no case shall such action supersede the host institution's responsibility for and authority over its employees.

Section II. Participation in CPS Governance

1. The Executive Director

The Executive Director will serve on the CPS Advisory Committee to the Director.

2. Senior Staff

Members of the Senior Staff of ICPSR may vote for and serve as the representative of professional and administrative staff persons on the CPS Advisory Committee to the Director.

Section III. Authority of the Executive Director and Senior Staff

The Executive Director and ICPSR senior staff are authorized to act on behalf of CPS and the ICPSR Council in the conduct of ICPSR activities, subject to normal regulations of CPS, ISR, and the University. Such actions will be subject to review and approval by appropriate governing mechanisms of the ICPSR Council and CPS. These governing mechanisms will be kept fully informed, with the greatest practicable timeliness, with respect to ICPSR activities.

Section IV. Fiscal Relationship

1. Fiscal Agent

CPS, acting under the authority of the Regents of the University, will serve as the fiscal agent of the ICPSR. CPS will provide administrative services necessary for the management of funds from membership dues, external grants and contracts, and other sources of income.

2. Membership Dues

Membership dues will be handled, within the fiscal regulations of the University, as expendable restricted funds that may be invested in interest-bearing accounts. The modalities for investing ICPSR funds will be determined by the appropriate administrative and fiscal officers in accordance with University investment standards with the advice of the Executive Director, the Chairperson or a Council member designated by the Chairperson and the Director.

3. Indirect Costs and Assessments

Indirect costs on membership dues will be assessed at a rate of fifteen (15) per cent. Indirect costs on all other income shall be assessed according to normal CPS, ISR, and University procedures. CPS shall not assess any charges on ICPSR accounts other than those assessed on CPS programs generally.

4. Open Records

The Director will provide the ICPSR Council with an annual CPS financial statement, including past and proposed expenditures, and such related financial information as is appropriate and necessary for Council to meet its responsibilities. The Chairperson, or a Council member designated by the Chairperson, will be granted full access to CPS financial statements. The Executive Director will have full access to all CPS and ISR financial statements.

5. Discretionary Funds

ICPSR shall have access to CPS discretionary funds under the normal CPS procedures governing the use of these funds. As a member of the Advisory Committee to the Director, the Executive Director will be informed of and participate in decisions relating to the use of CPS discretionary funds.

6. Fiscal Equity

As an organizational and fiscal subunit of CPS and ISR, ICPSR shares the fiscal burdens and privileges of these bodies. CPS and ISR are committed to insuring that ICPSR shares the burdens and benefits from the privileges in a proportionate and equitable manner. Over time, ICPSR shall receive benefits commensurate with its fiscal contributions and comparable to those received by other components of CPS.

Section V. Responsibilities of CPS and ISR

1. Administrative Services

CPS will provide administrative services necessary for the management of ICPSR funds and the procedural oversight of ICPSR activities. Separate accounts will be maintained by CPS for the ICPSR Operating Budget, supported by annual membership dues and other sources, and for each grant or contract received by the ICPSR. ICPSR budgets and accounts will be subject to normal CPS administrative and supervisory requirements and to auditing procedures required by the University.

2. Space and Other Resources

CPS will facilitate the activities of ICPSR, within the limits of available space, services, and resources, in an equitable manner with respect to other activities and subunits/subunits of CPS.

3. Attendance at ICPSR Meetings

The Director or a person designated by the Director is expected to attend the open sessions of regular meetings of the ICPSR Council and meetings of the Official Representatives of member institutions. The CPS representative will not be a voting member at such meetings.

4. ISR

The ICPSR staff may use ISR facilities and resources and call upon the various units of ISR for assistance in the same manner as may Programs of CPS.

5. Resolution of Disagreements

A disagreement between ICPSR and CPS or other parties about the terms or procedures of this agreement, or about related issues, may be referred to the Chairperson for discussion. If the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, any party may request mediation by the Director of ISR.

Section VI. Amendment

The terms of this agreement may be amended by concurring majority votes of the ICPSR Council and the Program Directors of CPS. This agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement, or upon one year's notice by either party.
