



# CALL FOR APPLICATIONS: 2025 ICPSR Summer Program in Quantitative Methods

**Deadline: December 1, 2024**

The American Political Science Association (APSA) is pleased to announce a Call for Applications from early-career scholars based in the Arab MENA region who are interested in attending the 2025 ICPSR Summer Program in Quantitative Methods of Social Research. APSA, in collaboration with the Inter-University Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR), will support up to three Arab MENA scholars to attend the General Session training program at the University of Michigan.

For summer 2025, the ICPSR Summer Program will offer rigorous instruction in statistics, quantitative methods, and data analysis in an in-person program designed to maximize learning and engagement. The Institute will offer two General Sessions: the First Session will take place from **June 9-July 3, 2025** and the Second Session from **July 7-August 1, 2025**. Classes will be offered in-person (on the University of Michigan campus in Ann Arbor) and online. All participants will have extended online access to lecture recordings and course materials after each session has ended. As in previous years, the 2025 Program will feature a broad curriculum ranging from introductory to advanced courses in a variety of methods and techniques. The Summer Program's instructional staff will also be available for individual consultation with participants before and during the General Sessions.

The 2025 detailed schedule and courses will be posted by early February. Prospective applicants can check the [2024 courses](#) but expect some changes to content, times, and instructors. Registration for all courses will open in early February 2025. Selected participants will have their participation fees waived and will have access to the reading material and statistical software (if required) via ICPSR and the University of Michigan. APSA will also cover housing fees for in-person participants to live on the University of Michigan central campus (where all classes will be held) in a student residence hall. Participants must be proficient in English and **commit to attending one of the General Sessions – either the First Session OR the Second Session** -- in full. Interested applicants should submit the necessary material by the deadline through this [online form](#):

1. A detailed and recent Curriculum Vitae / Resume.
2. A one-page cover letter describing, in detail, your motivation to attend the Summer Program, which courses you are interested in, and how this training will benefit your research plans and/or professional development. **Please be as specific as possible.**
3. One letter of reference on official letterhead and scanned as an electronic file (**optional**). Letters of support may come from a mentor, dissertation supervisor, or department chair. Letters may be uploaded directly via the online form or submitted separately to [menaworkshops@apsanet.org](mailto:menaworkshops@apsanet.org).

The deadline for applications is **December 1, 2024**. Selected scholars will be informed by the end of December.
